1:05	SWDH Updates	Cas, SWDH	<p>SWDH Standing Updates</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Western Idaho Youth Support Center <p>In November there were 14 admissions ranging from 11-16 years old. 9 out of 14 were first ever visits and 13 out of 14 were for mental health reasons only. All clients returned back to their homes or families safely after discharge. Remodel continues to go well. Cas went on a walkthrough with Clarvida last week. The remodel should be complete by the contracted date of 1/22, but no opening date has been determined, in case the remodel is delayed.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Funding and Budgets <p>We still do not have a contract from Magellan. We are under the impression that we are not the only crisis centers without a contract. No additional details are known at this time.</p> <p>Cas presented on WIDCCC revenue and expenditures in FY25 so far. We are in a good position with the budget, spending only ~79% of our existing revenue and well under the total expected revenue five months into the fiscal year.</p>	
1:20	Crisis Center Update	Abigail, Clarvida	<p>Monthly WIDCCC Presentation & Discussion</p> <p>November numbers remain high with 164 total episodes, 145 full episodes and 19 non-episodes (which is a little higher than normal).</p>	

			<p>Abigail is continuing to promote the center with community partners. There were 105 male clients, 40 female clients with 72 self-referrals, 45 agency referrals (more than normal!), and 26 referrals from other sources like friends and family.</p> <p>Only 1 SUD only visit with 121 MH only visit, and 23 concurrent need visits. There were 25 first time visitors and 9 veteran visitors.</p> <p>There were 9 diversions from harm to self or others, 57 diversions from the hospital, 11 prevented from drug/alcohol use, and 12 diversions from 911/law enforcement.</p> <p>Abigail has been presenting a lot to law enforcement, including Middleton PD and Caldwell PD. Still waiting on Canyon County and Nampa PD.</p> <p>They've had some successes with a couple clients, one of which was able to secure a new job and another that has found housing and a new job serving local individuals who are food insecure.</p> <p>Questions:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> -Does the center have everything they need so far in terms of winter clothing? -A: Yes, they have received several donations, including momentum from staff to donate their own unused clothing. -What do referrals from 988 and mobile crisis look like? -A: 988 referrals are difficult to track because we aren't fully integrated into the Magellan BHL system. It'll be easier to know when that integration takes place. Our mobile response team referrals are comparable to other parts of the state. -Has there been an increase due to weather? -A: Yes! WIDCCC staff tried to get them to a shelter if they can, but that is difficult with the limited number of resources available locally.
