The staff are enjoying the new location. Average weekly census is increasing and we are starting to see some clients younger than 10 years old.</li> <li>WIDCCC Funding and Budgets                Due to turnover on the finance team some financial processes have had to be prioritized. FY26 Budget finalization, payroll, and paying the bills have taken the highest priority, so there Cas was unable to provide a report on the budget. Budget managers rely on reports from the finance team to reconcile their budgets on a monthly basis. Nothing unexpected occurred that causes Cas to concern about WIDCCC’s revenue or expenditures.                There is no contract from Magellan, but Cas and her supervisor are trying to maintain contact with them to get more information/clarification. Cas thinks that it’s possible Magellan currently has other priorities.</li> </ul>	
1:20	Crisis Center Update	Drew, Clarvida	Monthly WIDCCC Presentation & Discussion We did introductions and learned more about Drew, the new program manager for the Region 3 Crisis Centers. Drew has replaced the Abigail. February saw an increase in overall census from January to February (69 full episodes -> 97 full episodes) with 28% of clients visiting the center for the first time. In February there were 69 visits from males, 34 visits from females, 63 self-referrals,	

			<p>33 agency referrals, 84 mental health visits, 1 SUD only visit, and 12 combination visits or for unknown reasons.</p> <p>8 episodes declared veteran status and what we believe is the first ever we served 1 active-duty military individual.</p> <p>69% of episodes were from people experiencing homelessness.</p> <p>There were 6 diversions from harm to self/others, 23 from hospitals, 13 from drugs/alcohol, and 21 from 911/LE. Drew is happy to see that individuals are getting the help they need from the crisis center.</p> <p>More than half of the clients in February had only been to center 5 or less times.</p> <p>At the beginning of March, a former client came to the center to share that he was doing really well, including being accepted into a sober living home, is on track to get his own apartment, and has held a job since December.</p> <p>Cas asked the group if there was any information the group would like to see from Clarvida on an ongoing basis. The group suggested more qualitative information (what's going well, what's not going well, what can the group help the center with), more detailed information on who is referring people to the center, and rural partnership engagement.</p> <p>Cas is going to begin providing a rural partnership engagement update to the group every month and will loop in Wendy on this, since she does the majority of partnerships engagement for the crisis centers.</p>
