1:05	SWDH Updates	Cas & Wendy, SWDH	<p>SWDH Standing Updates</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Western Idaho Youth Support Center</li> </ul> <p>The transition to the youth center location continues to go well. We had a record 25 admissions and 2 non-episodes in March. So far, the youngest we have served is 8, with 9 being the youngest in March.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>WIDCCC Funding and Budgets</li> </ul> <p>There continues to be delays in budget tracking documents, so Cas didn't share the budget summary.</p> <p>There have been no unusual expenditures and revenue is on track. Last month, the tracking reports didn't show that we were paid by Magellan, but it just hadn't hit the system.</p> <p>We have been in communication with District 2 who has the same model of back-bone agency for adult crisis centers with subcontracted direct service providers – they received their fully executed contract from Magellan.</p> <p>Magellan has let us know that we will receive our paperwork shortly!</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Rural Outreach Update</li> </ul> <p>Wendy provided a rural outreach update, including how many individuals have received her outreach and trainings in each county and some examples of organizations she's connected with in a variety of counties, including law enforcement, justice system, dispatch/EMS, schools, pediatricians, victims services, Community Health Action</p>	<p>Cas will provide Kelly with Wendy's contact info, so that he can send her contacts for the prosecuting office and Rim Rock School.</p> <p>Vito will provide Wendy with Payette County contacts.</p>

			<p>Teams, health systems, and more.</p> <p>Wendy has reached people and organizations through meetings and training in all six counties served by SWDH but needs some support with connecting with more organizations in Payette County.</p> <p>Wendy was asked if she's connected to the recovery centers – she wasn't familiar with the new one but has been connected to the one in Gem County.</p>	
1:25	Crisis Center Update	Drew, Clarvida	<p><b>Monthly WIDCCC Presentation &amp; Discussion</b></p> <p>Monthly census in March increased from January/February, with 111 full episodes and 11 non-episodes.</p> <p>We served more males than females, more MH only care than SUD only or both, and had more self-referrals than other referrals, including agency referrals.</p> <p>We served three veterans.</p> <p>63% of all clients were homeless, not including those at-risk of homelessness and 25% of clients visited for the first time.</p> <p>There were several diversions from harm to self/others, substance use, jail, and emergency departments.</p> <p>We discussed in-coming referrals further, including the number of those that came from law enforcement and health systems.</p> <p>Cas clarified that the EHR Clarvida uses does not allow input of agency specifics, but Drew will add a slide moving forward of more specifically what types of agencies are referring and how many.</p> <p>The group is also interested in seeing where the clients come from (county).</p> <p>The WIDCCC food license lapsed because the renewal notices didn't go to the right address - Drew took care of this with the SWDH food protection program.</p> <p>Drew was asked if they're fully staffed – they are for the most part – they just hired a med tech and are looking for a couple peer supports, but outside of that, they're good.</p> <p>Drew was asked if they're good on donations – WIDCCC can always use donations of clothing, socks, blankets, but usually everything else is taken care of like food and personal care items.</p>	Cas will make sure Drew has Puruses with a Purpose contact information for personal hygiene products.
