1:20	I	YouthROC Update <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Project management transition – Cas is now covering YouthROC. Nothing is changing other than Cas is splitting her time between the programs and other duties. • Data snapshot – Cas is getting a handle on the data. In 2025 there were 236 referrals to the YouthROC program. About half of those became clients throughout the year. Almost all of that half went along to assessment. There were 143 completed assessments. Of those 117 youth stayed in the program and participated. Remember there are 6 case managers working with these youth. • Funding and budgets – So far we’re looking good through this fiscal year, FY26. We anticipate \$70k in carry forward into FY27. We don’t know right now how YouthROC will be funded in FY27. There was an application (by Idaho Behavioral Health Council) for funding. The program may not be fully funded in FY27. Sustainability was a huge part of the funding request. We will most likely be looking for additional funding. Cas will be focusing on this. 	Cas, SWDH
